About our Ambassador Program

The Ambassador serves a crucial role as a liaison for the Foundation, collaborating with the CFF to promote support services for farmworkers.

This Ambassador is appointed by their company, to facilitate access to farmworkers at their worksites and advocates for the resources that the CFF offers.

Key Responsibilities

1. Provide access to farmworkers/crews at the worksite
2. Promote CFF programs, services, projects, and activities
3. Distribute CFF promotional materials to their employees (brochures, flyers, posters, etc.)
4. Participate in the development and implementation of CFF programs
5. Attend Ambassador trainings and workshops



Farmworker Advisory Council (FAC)

FAC also known in Spanish as “Consejo de Trabajadores Agrícolas”

About FAC:

- Representatives across each CFF service area to validate priorities - food, health & education.

Purpose:

- Establish a safe platform to elevate the farmworkers perspective, inform stakeholders and decision makers to address their needs.

Structure & Funding

- Costs cover participation honorariums, travel and time
- Administrative staff to facilitate convening forums
- External requests for farmworker representation
